


Results were considered statistically significant when P<0,05





The **number of residents in each department** showed statistically significant correlation to the **type of institution** (P<0,0001)

This is due to differences between the number of residents in **Peripheral Hospitals** and **University** or **Central-Reference Hospitals** (post hoc tests)

The vacant positions in each department did not show statistically significant correlation to the type of institution (P=0,224)




If you answered Yes in question 12, describe your involvement in frozen section procedure






What is your involvement in the autopsy pathology report?





The **establishment of an educational supervisor** did not show statistically significant correlation to the **type of institution** (P=0,350)

The efficiency of the educational supervisor showed statistically significant correlation to the type of institution (P=0,002). The educational supervisors of the residents of **Peripheral Hospitals** were more easy to find and helpful

I screen the case independently and write a report, which is finalized by the consultant: 170 (59,6%)


I screen the case in the multiheaded microscope together with the consultant and participate in the formulation of the final report: 29 (10,2%)

Both: 85 (29,8%)

Other Answers: screening of the case after the consultant finalizes the report

The role of the resident in the microscopic examination of the cases showed statistically significant correlation to the type of institution (P=0,016), but not with the number of examined cases per year (P=0,288). The residents of University Hospitals screen the cases independently and write a report, which is finalized by the consultant more often than the residents of Central-Reference or Peripheral Hospitals

The adequacy of time for the microscopic examination of the cases as judged by the residents showed

statistically significant correlation to the type of

institution (P=0,033), but not with

the number of examined cases per year



The access of the residents to pathology reference books and relevant scientific journals showed statistically significant correlation to the type of institution (P=0,012)

The motives for participation of the residents in research showed statistically significant correlation to the type of institution (P<0,0001)

The residents of **University** or **Central-Reference Hospitals** are more often encouraged to participate in research than the residents of **Peripheral Hospitals**

The work hours per week did not show statistically significant correlation to the **type of institution** (P=0,108), but they did show statistically significant correlation to the **number of cases examined per year** (P=0,017)

Mean **241** cases (Range: 10-3000)

The **examined by the resident cases per month** showed statistically significant correlation to the **type of institution** (P=0,043) and to the **number of cases examined per year** (P=0,003).

This is due to differences between **University** and **Peripheral Hospitals**





49) Are you satisfied with your salary?



The **satisfactory salary** showed statistically significant correlation to the **type of institution** (P=0,010), but not to the **number of** cases examined per year (P=0,949).

The residents of **Peripheral Hospitals** seem more satisfied with their salary than the residents of **University** or **Central-Reference Hospitals** (42% vs 71,8%)
