



Infectious Disease Pathology working group of the European Society of Pathology

Report 2013 to 2015

Founded in 2005 at the ESP annual meeting in Paris, the working group of Infectious Disease pathology can celebrate this year the 10-year-anniversary! Since then, the working group has participated in all congresses and intercongresses (except the intercongress 2006) by own sessions, including symposia and slide seminars.

Modern surgical and anatomic pathology is very much focussed on neoplastic diseases. However, based on the increased number of immunocompromised patients for various reason, including the ageing population as well as the raising number of immigrants and refugees, the pathologist should be aware and familiar with the morphology of infectious diseases. In addition, due to the increasing possibilities in auxiliary methods, including immunohistochemistry and molecular techniques, pathologists can make appropriate diagnoses in a much wider range of lesions.

Based on the strong cross sectional character of the pathology of infectious diseases the working group early started to perform joint sessions with various other working groups in which infections are more or less common.
