Course Objectives

The Edinburgh Haematopathology Tutorial takes place annually and is designed to provide a practical approach to different topics in Haematopathology. This year's tutorial explores lymphomas arising at extranodal sites. Sessions will cover the spectrum of gastrointestinal lymphoma, splenic lymphomas, lymphoma in the bone marrow, mediastinal lymphomas and lymphomas arising at other non-cutaneous extranodal sites. The course is primarily case based. H&E sections and relevant immunohistochemically stained slides from approximately 40 challenging and instructive cases will be scanned and made available for delegates to view prior to the meeting. These cases will be presented and discussed during the meeting by our group of internationally renowned tutors. To facilitate discussion, tutors will provide an overview of the areas covered, with emphasis on recent diagnostic advances. Audience participation is strongly encouraged to create a relaxed and enjoyable learning environment. Electronic copies of all case discussions and lectures will be made available after the course, and the scanned cases will also remain accessible on the webserver for a finite time thereafter, allowing delegates to revisit learning points at their convenience. At the conclusion of the course, participants will have been updated on a broad range of problem areas pertinent to lymphoma diagnosis and be equipped with a practical approach to resolving difficult diagnostic dilemmas as they are encountered in routine practice. The course is suited to practising Haematopathologists, as well as Pathologists with an interest in Haematopathology or lymphoma diagnosis, and Pathologists in training.

Attendance is limited to 70 participants. Credit for 14 CPD points is currently being obtained from the Royal College of Pathologists
