

## **ESP Working Group for Paediatric and Perinatal Pathology – Report from London ECP**

The 27th European Society of Pathology Meeting was held in Belgrade, Serbia, between 5<sup>th</sup> September - 9<sup>th</sup> September 2015.

In the last meetings the Paediatric and Perinatal Pathology WG has been steadily improving the number of pathologists attending our sessions. This was again sustained this year.

In Belgrade, the Paediatric and Perinatal Working Group hosted 5 sessions. In addition, there was an oral free paper session with 10 papers that were accepted for oral presentation and a poster session with 37 posters on display.

A key piece for our achievement has always been the hard work of our working group and the selection of topics of areas of interest to general pathologists.

This year 3 sessions were performed jointly with other WGs (the slide seminar “Cardiovascular causes of sudden death”, the short course “Cholestasis: from newborn to adult” and the symposium “Lymph node pathology in children”) and produced another added value. The Paediatric and Perinatal Pathology WG strictly adheres to the spirit of the ESP, which guarantees a valuable educational experience by encouraging innovation, friendship and professional collaborations.

The Business meeting of the WG took place on the 6<sup>th</sup> September. We had 3 excellent presentations (“The diagnosis of disorders of sex development from the pathologist point of view. the value of gonadal biopsy” by Pilar Gonzalez Peramat, “Paediatric renal tumours: an update” by Gordan Vujanik and a lecture on cardiac malformations by Prof. Jovan Vasiljevic).

Isabel Colmenero apologised for absence and Marta Cohen was so kind to replace her co-chairing the BM.

We had the opportunity to stress the need of all pathologists that have an interest on Paediatric and Perinatal to become members of the WG. The ESP recently changed the website and the process of becoming member of the WGs is now done online.

However, it is not very user-friendly and we had the opportunity to ask for some improvements during the ESP WG chair meeting that took place on the 5<sup>th</sup> September. We have currently 33 registered members.

We also had the opportunity to present the draft of the programme to Cologne 2016 that was conceived in collaboration with IAP and the German Society of Pathology. We asked all members to send us suggestions with topics that and considered interesting and that can be included in future meetings.

For 2016 Cologne Congress the ESP and IAP nominated 2 convenors, Paula Borrhalho for Placental Pathology and Marta Cohen for Paediatric and Perinatal Pathology. The local convenors nominated were Ivo Leuschner and Annette M. Müller.
