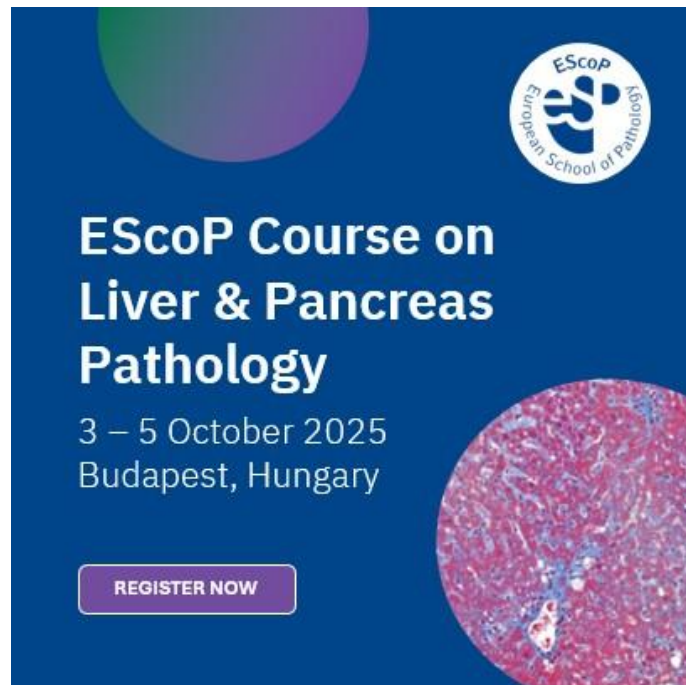


European School of Pathology (EScoP) course for Liver and Pancreas Pathology

Learning Objectives:

This course will be an introduction to the subspecialties of Liver and Pancreas Pathology. The programme includes both theory lectures and real-life examples provided via slide seminars. Participants will learn about neoplasms of Liver and Pancreas, as well as common non-neoplastic diseases. For each session there will be sufficient time for discussion, resulting to an interactive course.

Target Audience:

The course is designed for Pathologists at the beginning of the subspecialty training. However, Pathologists at all levels of experience, from residents to established experts, are welcome to register.
